



The Passion Behind Grant Review





Onward Soldiers Hard At Work

"Growing up, my family was always the first to volunteer for something at our church or in our community. I've seen firsthand that when Walker County sees a problem, there is nothing that is going to stop it from finding a solution.

As soon as the Easter Sunday tornadoes came through in 2020, I reached out to the Foundation to ask what was needed and what the steps were to get involved. The Foundation immediately set me up with Walker County Emergency Management Agency. We assessed needs and realized that we did not qualify for FEMA assistance. The Foundation stepped in and reopened the Long-term Recovery Committee. We began meeting each week to help our affected citizens become safe, sanitary, and secure again.

Any time that you contact anyone from the Foundation, the answer is never, 'No.' It is, 'Let me find out how to find a solution.' It may not be a typical answer, but all of the different people and resources that the Foundation brings together make things happen."



Reed Jackson has been a dedicated member of both the Longterm Recovery Committee and the Onward Fund for the last two years. The Onward Fund considers cases in which clients have issues that are outside the bounds of normal nonprofit funding and therefore stop forward progress for families; clients whose income has been stable but an emergent situation has created a single need that nonprofits cannot support (i.e., broken car part); deferred maintenance on homes that are owned by the client that create an environment that is not safe, sanitary or secure; and foster families in support of preparing their home for foster children, as well as to meet the needs of children once placed.

Reed decided to get involved with the Foundation when he and his family moved back to Jasper and saw first-hand what the Foundation was doing and the positive direction in which it was propelling Walker County forward. Reed believes the most rewarding part of being involved with the Foundation is giving people a chance. Not just help, but a chance. Reed Currently serves on the review team for our Onward Fund as well as the Long-term Recovery Committee and is instrumental in keeping our momentum going. According to Reed, "The Foundation is great at developing a plan of action and is committed to the success of that plan."

How Transportation Gets Moving

Deidre Tatum is the Executive Director of the Walker County Community Action Agency which assists with multiple programs that help low-income families and community members reach self-sufficiency. Deidre states, "Transportation is one of the biggest needs in our community. Every 2 to 3 years our organization does a community needs assessment, and since 2008, transportation has been one of the most pressing needs."

Recently, the Community Action Agency has taken on the challenge and by creating the Walker County Transportation System through partnerships with the Walker County Commission, Federal Transit Administration, Alabama Department of Transportation, City of Jasper, City of Cordova, City of Sumiton, and the Walker Area Community Foundation. These organizations are working towards the goal of providing affordable transportation throughout the entirety of Walker County.

The Walker County Transportation System is working to overcome the route system and has developed what is called the demand response system. Clients now have the ability to request a ride 24 hours in advance by simply calling 205-265-3989 on Monday — Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. The fee is \$2.00 for every 5 miles per one-way trip, and buses are handicap accessible.

Transportation System buses run Monday through Friday 6 a.m. - 6 p.m. and Saturday 6 a.m. - 12 p.m. Contract services are available for companies and organizations with specific transit needs.

"The Foundation has been very supportive both in funding and through developing programs, some that don't even exist yet. The Foundation's Onward Fund has helped so many people, and I get to see first-hand how it helps. I do what I do because it is my heart. Do unto others as you would have them do unto you. If you see a person or community that is in need, it is natural to reach out and help solve some of the problems in our community."



Bankhead House & Heritage Center

Archives from the Attic

We have thousands of items in our archives, so most items are not part of our semi-permanent exhibits. Here are a couple of the artifacts you may not get to see the next time you visit the Heritage Center.





Fossils from Walker County

This fossil offers a glimpse into a part of our area from millions of years in the past when part of present-day Walker County was covered in water. We have a set of fossils on display in the Walker County Room; however, this fossil has never been viewed by the public.

LYCOPODIOPHYTA (sometimes called Lycophyta or Lycopods) is the oldest living vascular plant division at around 410 million years old. The swamp forests of the Minkin site represented a well-established ecosystem. Carboniferous forests contained lycopod "pole (or scale) trees" up to about 132 feet tall, and understory plants that subsisted on sunlight that made it through the open lycopod canopy.

Union Chapel Mine Trackway Bed

Please Note: This area is NOT open to the public

In 1999, Alabama Paleontological Society (APS) member Ashley Allen scouted a surface coal mine in Walker County, Alabama, and discovered a treasure trove of vertebrate trackways and other trace fossils that had been imprinted on a tidal mud flat 310 million years before.

The mine, known as the Union Chapel Mine, was owned by New Acton Coal Co. It was recently named the Steven C. Minkin Paleozoic Footprint Site after Mr. Robert Reed, Sr. donated the land to the State of Alabama. Today the property is managed by the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources with input from the APS.

This site is recognized as the most prolific Carboniferous track site in the world. Now, that is a significant recognition that makes us proud of Walker County!





Bankhead House & Heritage Center Exhibit Committee

As you visit a heritage center or museum, do you ever wonder what it takes to make the exhibit you are viewing possible?

The responsibility for the content of an exhibition varies from place to place, but at the Bankhead House & Heritage Center we review ideas, decide on a concept, figure out how we will get the items to display (if we do not have them in our collection), and consider the overall story we want to tell. We are very fortunate to have a group of dedicated volunteers on our Exhibit Committee working diligently to preserve the history of Walker County and the surrounding area, while honoring our present and inspiring the future of our communities.

A special thank you goes to our Exhibit Committee of Brenda Beard-Chairman, Carl Goforth, Helen Morrison, and Pat Morrison. Brenda, Helen, and Pat started working together in 2010 when the concept for our Heritage Center first began. Carl joined the committee in 2019. Along with coordinating exhibits, they also conduct tours for schools and groups, collect artifacts, and host events. It could be considered a full-time job, and they give graciously of their time.
